ANN SCRUTON Born 1839

Beech Cottage, Jewitt Lane

daughter Annie, born 1865, were living in Beech Cottage during WW1. Annie had grown up in Goldsbrough, one of three daughters of Enoch Scruton, Corn Miller, and Ann his wife. Annie did not marry but lived with her parents until Enoch's death in Goldsbrough in 1905. After his death the two women moved to Beech Cottage where they let a room to a lodger, a clergyman of the Established Church.

Dora Mary Harland was born in Leeds in 1896, the second of four children born to Thomas and Mary Helen nee Hogg. Thomas worked as a Laundryman in Harehills. He moved the family to Fern Bank in 1916 and it was from here that Dora joined the VAD. She worked as a Dispenser at the Red Cross Auxiliary Hospital, Grimsby until 1919. In 1924 she married Cecil Herbert Griffith from Somerset who, being four years younger, had served in the army reserve but had not been called up. In 1928 their only child, Philip, was born. Dora died in Dorset in 1985

Joseph Goss was born in 1862, one of 6 sons of a Rag Merchant from Ireland. His mother died when he was a young child and he grew up with his brothers and father in Leeds. Joseph joined his father in business. In 1892 Joseph married Sara and shortly afterwards they moved to Hill Top House. They had 7 children of whom the two oldest died. One son joined the business and the other studied medicine at Leeds.

When William Hollings and his wife Lucy married they moved to Collingham where William worked as a Provisions Merchant. There were no children from this marriage. They appear to have left Hill Top Cottage during WW1 and William died in York in 1947.

Providence Cottage

At the start of WW1 Hill Top cottage was lived in by Percy and Mary Fletcher and their young sons, Edward and Frank. Percy worked as a Carter and during the war they moved down to live in one of the Station Cottages in Collingham By 1917 the cottage was home to George Maggs, a solicitor from Leeds who married Lavinia Cooke in 1887. Prior to the war he lived in Oakwell Hall, Birstall, George joined the army in 1914 and served in UK and Ireland, rising to rank of Major. During the war Lavinia moved to Collingham and settled in Hill Top Cottage. George died in Dorset in 1945

William Adkin was born in Collingham in 1840, the son of a farm worker. He lived his entire life in Collingham and met his wife Sarah Groves while working on John Groves farm. William moved to Providence Cottage as a clerk in the leather trade. There were no children and Sarah died in 1895 but William continued to live at Providence Cottage until his death in 1922. Sarah's nephew, Charles William Groves lived in the cottage after the death of his uncle.
