ALBERT YOUNG
Born 1873

Tax Collector lived here during WW1

with his wife Lily , daughter Leslie and Lily's brother, Percy, Dental Mechanic

Albert Young was born in Terrington, N Yorks, in 1873. His father, Turner Young married his mother Annie in 1872 in Terrington but died three years later when Albert was only two years old. His childhood was spent in Terrington living with his mother and grandparents. His grandfather was working as a garden labourer. At the age of 28 Albert was living in Collingham with his uncle Charles Catley. Albert married Lillie Maude in St Oswald's church in 1903 and their son, Leslie was born in 1910. Albert died in Collingham in 1934.

HENRY CHURCH Born 1885

Government Valuer lived here during WW1

with his wife May and son William

Henry George Church was born in Market Harborough, Leicestershire and grew up with his father who was a Corn Factor, his mother and four siblings. He married May in 1909 and their son, William Henry was born in Collingham the following year. Henry died in Harrogate in 1973

THOMAS JEFFRIES

Born 1858

Watch maker & jeweller lived here during WW1

with his wife Edith widowed sister-in-law

Thomas Marmont Jefferies was born in Leeds in 1858 and grew up with father, Benjamin and mother, Eliza and two siblings. His father worked as a jeweller and Thomas followed him into the business and is listed as a retired jeweller in the 1911 census. In 1898 Thomas married Edith and by 1911 was living in Collingham with Edith's widowed sister, Marie Annie Ingleby. Thomas and Edith did not have children and Thomas died, in poverty, in Leeds in1933
