

Samuel Dalby was born in Linton in 1873, the ninth of ten children of John Dalby, Market Gardener, and his wife Elizabeth. At the time of his marriage to Annie Gant from Tadcaster, in 1901, Samuel is recorded as working as a gardener but it was not long before he took the job of Horseman to Golf Club, when the mowers were horsedrqwn. The couple had seven children, five of whom survived childhood. Annie died in 1948 and Samuel in 1952.

Sampson Kitchen was born in Bramham in 1849, the oldest of six children whose father was a Farm Worker. Sampson married Fanny Waterman, from Great Ouseburn, in 1874 and they moved to Linton where they brought up their eight children. Sampson worked as a Highways Labourer. By the start of WW1 Sampson and Fanny were living in this cottage with eighteen year old Alice, a domestic servant from the village. Sampson died in 1915.

Isabella was born in Linton on Ouse in 1836. She married William Swann, an agricultural worker, and moved to his home village of Linton on Wharfe. They had nine children, seven daughters and two sons. The eldest daughter, Elizabeth, married John Dalby of Linton and the couple lived with their children in Northgate Lane. Isabella died in 1919, twenty eight years after the death of William.

George Swann, first son of Isabella and William Swann was born in Linton in 1868, the forth of nine children. In 1891 he married Frances Kate Haldenby, also from Linton, in St James' church, Wetherby. They continued to live in Linton as George worked as a labourer to support their four children. Their eldest son, John William Swann, was born in 1897. At the age of eighteen he emigrated to Quebec, leaving Southampton on 19 May 1913. With the outbreak of war he enlisted in the Canadian Expeditionary Force and died fighting in France on 31 August 1918.

HENRY HOLMES

Henry Holmes was born in Stamford Bridge in 1843, the son of a Farm Worker. He married Mary Pick from Little Ribston in 1872. At that time it is recorded that he was farming 50 acres and employed thirteen men. After the birth of their first son, Edward, they moved to Ings Farm. Henry and Mary went on to have 8 more children, six of whom survived childhood. By the end of WW1 Edward was running the farm with the help of his four sisters.
